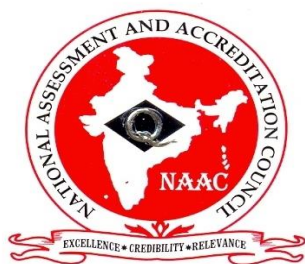
Evidence of Success :
